Recently, the Illinois State Board of Education released its annual State School Report Card. Our gains reflect a team effort by our staff, parents and community members, Board of Education and most importantly, our students. The chart below shows tremendous gains in both reading and math during the past three years.

Heroin Awareness Presentations January 29

The presentation will include local police, recovering heroin addicts and family members affected by heroin addiction. Students will also hear from the DuPage County Coroner. Seniors Prepare for Compass Math Placement Test



This fall, senior students enrolled in College Algebra traveled to the College of DuPage to take a practice Compass Math Placement Test. Compass tests are used by colleges and universities to determine which course level a student is eligible to enroll in. The goal of the trip was to familiarize students with the testing procedures and to produce a score from which they can improve upon. The students will take the test for a placement score in the spring.

High Credit Rating a Boost to District, Village

Bensenville District 2's credit rating of AA+ is a reflection of strong finances and a favorable outlook on the Bensenville area in general.

Standard & Poor's Rating Services reaffirmed the District's credit rating in October as part of a bond refinancing plan that is saving taxpayers \$1.4 million in interest through the year 2026.

The District's AA+ rating is just one step below the highest rating possible of AAA. The credit rating agency cited the District's financial management and the favorable economic characteristics of the Bensenville area.

"This credit rating represents a positive outlook for District 2 and the community as a whole," said Superintendent Dr. James Stelter.

Victoria Itzkow has been playing for four years with the park district, BBAA and Lady Bison feeder team.




"Our team was really confident this year. All the players have improved so much this year. We all have a positive attitude," Victoria said.
