NATIONAL MEDAL SUBMISSION:

Bensenville Library was nominated by Congressman Mike Quigley. Sieffert completed application securing letter of support from the community. The IMLS will announce finalist in early 2019.

DIGITIZATION SPECIALIST, YOUTH SERVICES LIBRARIAN, CIRCULATION HIRING UPDATES:

The Digitization Specialist is a grant-funded position. There were about seven applicants. Sloan made an offer and the applicant accepted. Sieffert had a lawyer draw up a contract.

The Youth Services Librarian is a bilingual position. Qualified applicant must speak Spanish. There have been multiple applicants but no one has Spanish fluency.

The Circulation department is losing Helen Garcia a clerk that has been with the library for almost 20 years. Feddersen is working on filling the position.

AFTER SCHOOL SNACK CART HIRING UPDATE:

Two new first year students will be working the snack cart. They will come in at the end of the month to fill out new-hire paperwork.

BUILDING UPDATES:

Green house: Being constructed behind Black Hawk Middle School. Stanek is assisting with construction. Feddersen is assisting the class, teaching gardening with using the Tower garden for the winter season.

Plumbing: The leak has been repaired. Stanek has retiled the floor. Pin hole leaks caused 16,000 gallons which is 3x what we usually use.

Cedar Sealcoating: All outside surfaces have been coated. This will reduce determination and Carpenter bees eating the wood. This should last for a minimum of five years.
