Reading aloud sparks creativity and imagination and is a wonderful way to bond with your child. Every time you read a book together, you're giving them the gifts of language, vocabulary, and the necessary pre-reading skills for starting kindergarten.

How to Participate

- **Who:** Any child who has not started kindergarten yet is encouraged to participate.
- How to Sign Up: Pick up your first paper log at the Youth Services desk. Read and color one circle on your log for each book you read together. You can include books read at storytime, books read to your child by others, recorded books, and books read on e-devices. If you read the same book more than once, you can record it every time.
- **Have Fun:** Come back to the library when you have read 100 books, collect your prize, and pick up additional reading logs.
